## ANTI-FASCISM HERE A MYTH, BALBO SAYS

General Tells Mussolini in Report That Greeting He Has Received Proves This.

ROME, July 23 (AP).—In a report wired to Premier Mussolini today, General Italo Balbo said that the existence of anti-Fascist sentiment abroad was a myth which was exploded by the enthusiastic welcome his air squadron has received in America. He declared that there was no sign of such a feeling anywhere, but that, on the contrary, Italians and Americans alike gave the fliers the most hospitable greet-

The man who probably will become Italy's first Air Marshal—a rank created Saturday at Mussolini's suggestion—devoted considerable space in the report to warm appreciation of President Roose-

"His sincere simplicity of ways, expert opinions and exquisite affability win one's friendship immediately," said General Balbo. He added that he found the President had a profound knowledge of avia-

The General said that President Roosevelt showed the highest esteem for Premier Mussolini and a deep understanding and appreciation of the spirit in which he was handling international problems. Enthusiastic over the reception given him and his companions in New York, General Balbo said: "Never in my life have I seen such an imposing gathering as that at the Madison Square Garden Bowl. It was an unforgettable spectacle."
